The Incredible Years Project provides advice and support to schools and organisations wishing to introduce the programmes into their service. The project accepts client referrals from schools within the greater Clondalkin area.

The Incredible Years Programme is a prevention and treatment programme for young children 3-9 years of age who experience emotional or behavioural difficulties. The programme has been tried and tested outside of Ireland and proves effective for 8 out of 10 children.

Basic parent Training programme is a 12 weeks programme for parents who wish to improve their skills in dealing positively with EBD

Advanced Parenting programme 8-10 weeks builds on the BPT and fosters better family communication and harmony in the home

Small Group Dina Programme is a 22 week programme focusing on the child , delivered in a number of schools to groups of up to 6 children for 2 hours per week

Teacher classroom management is a 5 day training programme for teachers to build proactive strategies into their classroom management .This training will focus directly on reducing problem behaviours in the classroom and benefits all children.

An Incredible Years parent support Network allows parents to have on-going support and contact with parents who have completed IY training.

Provides advocacy for whatever issues a person presents with, and aims to counteract the social exclusion of drug users.

Offers advice and information on a wide range of issues that affect drug users. Such as housing, health issues, social welfare entitlements, training and education, referrals for addiction counselling/ treatment

Operates a drug users forum for drug users active or otherwise from North Clondalkin on Tuesday nights 7pm-9pm, and similar on Wednesday night from 4pm-6pm in South West Clondalkin. This is an advocacy group who lobby and campaign for change within services for drug users.

Also provides training courses for stable drug users who are currently on a treatment programme or with a G.P. receiving treatment. These courses are pre-development and are aimed to progress drug users back into further training / workforce. There are two courses per year, one in North Clondalkin, one in Southwest. Each course runs for twelve weeks (3 mornings per week). All modules on the course are certified. Topics covered range from computers, personal development, health & safety, first aid etc
